



At first, C& D intended to work primarily in the private sector, constructing and refurbishing residential and commercial buildings. However, a shift in the industry's financial environment – specifically a dearth of government water and infrastructure projects that are necessary for new home construction - encouraged the company to seek out public sector work, as well. Today, Wint and his 30 full-time and 40+ temporary workers also take on civic projects such as health cen-

ters, post offices, and schools.

Like many other businesses in the housing industry in Jamaica and elsewhere, Wint's company was severely set back during the Great Recession.
